 many residents' concerns over the years and were influential in moving a number of
 projects forward, to name a few, for example:

 - Fire smart (removed ceders from front of building and 10ft from side of building)
 - New hall agreement

 - Gym equipment
 - Emergency siren

- I arranged for the Desert Cove logo which adds a bit of class to the Rec Ctr. We received approval from Management; I spoke to Bruce Downtown who graciously volunteered to make this for the community. We've had many positive comments about it.
- My greatest pleasure aside from all that, has been managing the monthly Artists display in our front hallway. Since January 2023, 36 artists have displayed their talent.
